"Kaya" (Hello) Regional tour, community encounters and community workshops.

Renowned artists of Nyoongar, desert and world-dance practice will tour "Kaya" and workshops to Bunbury, Kalgoorlie and desert lands. Created for the World LPG Conference "Kaya" will be expanded and developed throughout the tour, driven by the ensemble's experiences while working rurally, consulting with local elders and having dance exchanges on-country. The narrative celebrates the world's oldest living cultures and examines the danger and benefits of cross-cultural clash and collaboration.

Zest & Blues is a two festival tour staged over ten days and includes 12 performances at six events. The Kalbarri coastline and the bush line of Charles Darwin Reserve in Perenjori in September 2016 are the sites of community celebrations of place, of history and of arts and culture in remote Western Australia.

Fragmented Artists' 2016 tour of The List to regional Goldfields communities and Mt Barker in the Great Southern.
